Mississippi and Florida. It is designed to tell us that we need Mid level providers in our states (that is my opinion, but I could be wrong). We are awaiting the results of that survey. Now the legislation above has been introduced in Georgia late in the session so it can be studied over the summer. It will have its day in court (the legislature) next year. The source of this interest has come from The Caucus of Black State Legislators. They have encouraged its members to go to their states and introduce legislation.

There seems to be a new twist in the argument. The twist is that the proponents of mid levels seem to be trying to make what is a care issue a racial issue. How can anyone be an advocate for a two tiered system of care. Should this two tier system be put in place, there seems to be a grand irony in that the very patients that they claimed are placed in jeopardy will be subjected to a lesser standard of care. Also, the dentists who have been working to serve those in need are going to have their practices affected by a group of dental providers who can only perform the bread and butter services of their practices. No one wins.

A bright spot is that I have talked to leaders at the state and national level recently and they are optimistic that dentistry's plan to counter mid level providers will be a good plan for all of the patients, not just some of them. BUT, as always the ADA and GDA sources always state that in the end, it will come down to you and me making sure that we don't have a legislative breakdown. It will come down to asking does your legislator know you?? Your involvement and your future are directly related.

Once again, these are my opinions; but I could be wrong! Ty Ivey

- •Opening Discussion with difficulties getting timely submissions for the newsletter from the Base with scheduled speakers information. All participants in the discussion were amazed that this bill had any chance this year with all that legislators had on their plate. Our people at the Capitol are on it and when necessary can work on the contact dentists of key people in the committee it is assigned to.

- Public Relations: Dr. Holliday wanted everyone to notify him of changes to e-mail addresses if any. Also to think of ways to encourage sign up for GMOM coming up in June. This is a huge project and one that needs to be embraced by all our members and staff! Dr. Cassidy will make a presentation at Fridays' program as well as Thursday evening.

The Ty Report...I could be wrong!

Funny how someone says something to you and you remember it for a life time. While a key fact that you use all of the time will not stay in your brain. I practiced with Tom McKelvey for over 30 years and he told the story once that there was a great philosopher who was asked if he was willing to die for his beliefs? His answer was, "Of course not, I could be wrong!"

Well, on the matter of mid level providers, I could be wrong, but evidence is making a strong case, that I am right on the mark. At the end of the legislative session, Senator Valencia Seav dropped a bill to create mid level providers in Georgia. Besides the mountain of information that you have already received from me on the matter, there are new slants on this subject that have been put in play. The National Dental Association (NDA) has in the last year changed its position from opposing mid level providers to entertaining the idea of their value in dealing with access to care. When I spoke to Roy Adams and Lawrence Marable at a Central District meeting on this change, they were astounded and doubted that it was correct. But it is correct and you have to be curious if the \$400,000 donation from the Kellogg Foundation to the NDA had anything to do with that. The Pew Foundation and The Kellogg Foundation have put big bucks on the issue of mid levels and they are not above buying support if that is what it takes (Of course, this is my opinion. I could be wrong).

The efforts at Morehouse University to study the issue are also being driven by a former Kellogg Employee and funded by Kellogg money for heir survey. The survey in question encompasses Georgia,

- Sign up for the Donated Dental Services program as a volunteer.
- Dr. Torbush welcomed the members of the Leadership GDA Class of 2015.
- Mr. Capaldo invited the Board to participate in the dialogue generated by the guest speakers on multi-office dental groups, dental support organizations, and buying cooperatives.
- Dr. Charles Coulter, owner of Dentistry for Children, and Dr. Quinn Dufurrena, executive director of the Association for Dental Support Organizations, addressed the Board regarding the operations of the multioffice dental group, the administrative and other functions offered by the ADSO for the group's offices. Dr. Dufurrena updated the Board on meetings the ADSO had held with the American Dental Association regarding membership of dentists involved with multi-office dental groups as well as the ADSO's efforts at the state level in regards to legislative action.
- Dr. Kevin Cain, a Georgia Regents University Hull College of Business Assistant Professor of Management with an emphasis in dental consulting, addressed the Board on the potential benefits associated with a group purchasing initiative.
- Dr. John Ferguson asked the Board to support the products and services that GDIS offers and noted that GDIS continues to offer significant value for members. He discussed the rate of renewals for the GDA health and welfare plan and noted that GDIS hoped to offer additional health-related coverage, including Medicare supplemental coverage.
- GDIS won a Bronze Medal award among all MEDPRO agencies for having the best ratio of retained business for professional liability coverage at 96.7%. GDIS has been in the top three agencies nationwide with the highest retention rate for the last four years.
- Members are encouraged to save the date for GMOM 2015.

ADA REPORT by Kara G. Moore

What is the ADA doing for you?

- 1). The ADA has hired a new head of communications to help effectively convey the message of the ADA as well as to look at ways to better market the ADA dentist to the general public.
- 2). After recent publicity about the historical inaccuracies of the health effects of sugar Published by the National Institute of dental research, the ADA has formed a workgroup to advocate for more research on the role of sugar in the development of caries. From this they are hoping to make a formal position that is science based that will prove that it is the diet of this generation that is allowing the caries rate to skyrocket. (And no midlevel provider can solve that). Maybe with this new research instead of the governments investing millions in trying to create new types of low level providers they could instead change the way foods are made available to caries susceptible populations.
- 3) In an effort to engage more members the ADA is looking to create a more user friendly online/smartphone application that will help members better access the resources that our membership dollars pay for. Most members have no clue about all the resources available to you through your ADA membership
- 4). Legislatively the ADA has been very busy lobbying on our behalf on several different issues. This is by far one of the most important and yet non tangible member benefits we could ever receive. The ADA is hoping to purchase a new building near the Capital that will help in their efforts to have the dentists voice heard on a daily basis in DC.
